1	Please provide the chemical analysis / sampling report for the proposed dredge sediments. We need this information to identify and qualify disposal locations.	Will be addressed by Addendum No. 1.
2	Please consider a 2 week extension to the current bid due date of June 30.	A bid extension is not anticipated at this time.
3	Has an upland placement site been approved for this dredge material?	Refer to Contract Drawing IX001 GENERAL NOTES 10. The contractor shall identify and choose the upland placement facility.
4	Can the Port Authority provide the chemical data for the past year's contract?	Was addressed by Addendum No. 1 dated June 16, 2026.
5	Is there sample data available for this contract?	Was addressed by Addendum No. 1 dated June 16, 2026.
6	Is there a current dredging permit for this contract?	Refer to Contract booklet clause 103. LAWS AND ORDINANCES (pages 124 and 125) for permits.
7	Please provide the sampling and analysis plan for this work	Was addressed by Addendum No. 1 dated June 16, 2026. Refer to Contract Drawing IX001 GENERAL NOTES 10.
8	Please provide the sampling and analysis report	Was addressed by Addendum No. 1 dated June 16, 2026.
9	Please provide the analytical data set in an Excel comparison table for NY, NJ, and PA acceptance criteria.	Refer to Contract Drawing IX001 GENERAL NOTES 10, Paragraph 2. Follow the respective State's acceptance criteria and regulations.
10	Additionally, we again request a two (2) week extension to the current bid due date. This extension is required for the evaluation of upland disposal options and development of a cost-effective disposal option.	A bid extension is not anticipated at this time.
11	Could you let us know when PANYNJ anticipates awarding this work order/if there's an ideal notice proceed window to begin work?	Refer to Contract booklet clause 5. ACCEPTANCE OR REJECTION OF BID (page 6). Within sixty (60) days after the opening of the Bids.
12	May the Marine Protection & Indemnity liability minimum limit of \$5M be met with any combination of primary, excess, or umbrella insurance?	Yes. Refer to Contract booklet clause 70. INSURANCE PROCURED BY CONTRACTOR (pages 83 to 86).
