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The JFK Redevelopment Program

Overview

JFK Airport is undergoing a major modernization through the redevelopment program. The overall goal of this program is to create a 21st century world-class airport. Key elements of the program are designed to improve airport functionality, operational efficiency and customer ease of use of the facilities and overall satisfaction with the airport. This \$18.5 billion transformation will allow for a more unified, interconnected terminal layout, simplification of the on airport roadways, centralization of parking facilities, world class amenities, improvements to airside operations and the reduction of ground delays, development of state-of-the-art cargo facilities, increase in capacity of the AirTrain system, and improvements to roadway access and expanded rail mass transit to JFK. This includes an improved and simplified roadway system, the construction of a multi-story Ground Transportation Center with an envisioned green rooftop.



The image illustrates the improvements that will exist at the completion of the project (outside the terminal developments). Many of these improvements are already underway as there is a significant amount of work that goes into readying the areas for construction (see Project Spotlight on page 8 for an example). It is for this reason that we created the Airside Working Group and the Landside Working Group in order to coordinate with our stakeholders' work across multiple projects within the program.

The terminal redevelopments will transform the terminals and unused space into four modernized expansive terminals with world-class features

amenities. The Terminal 1 project will be a \$9.5B investment, Terminal 4 will be a \$1.5B investment, Terminal 6 will be a \$3.9B investment and Terminal 8 will be a \$0.5B investment. The image below shows the expansion and location of the four terminals at the completion of the redevelopment program.

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Around the Airport



Green Garage and AirTrain Station 2 Closing

The closing of the Green Garage is a sign that, JFK's redevelopment is well underway. The closing of the Green Garage enables the start of the redevelopment of Terminal 1 and Terminal 2. Terminal 1 and Terminal 2 parking has now moved to the Terminal 8 Red Garage.

Terminal 2 AirTrain station is also closed. Terminal 1 AirTrain Station is now being referred to as T1 and T2, as travelers will now use this station to get to both terminals. At the closing of Terminal 2 and completion of the New Terminal One, this station will become T1 AirTrain Station.

JFK Landside Operations created an additional customer prebooking-only parking lot, "Federal Circle Station Parking," that will open to the public on Monday, August 15th, 2022. As part of redevelopment, JFK parking capacity was reduced by approximately 1,600 spaces with the closure of the Green Garage. Alternative parking solutions were assessed to continue providing a world-class experience for our passengers as redevelopment progresses. With the assistance of Port Authority Operations and Maintenance Staff, this lot was adopted and introduced to the overall parking portfolio. The lot is conveniently located next to the Federal Circle AirTrain with easy access to the terminals.



JP Runway Cafe located on the first floor of Building 14 is now offering free delivery to terminal 4 and Terminal 6. They offer authentic Carribean cuisine as well as standard grill favorites. We are exploring a service change to the AirTrain between Terminals 1 and 2 in early fall. There will be shuttle buses provided to assist with commuting between Terminals 1 and 2, should this plan be adopted.

For that reason, PANYNJ was proud to have been formally recognized for its exemplary diversity and inclusion practices by the American Society for Public Administration (ASPA) and The Journal of Commerce.

In addition to the initiatives of their 25-point plan, PANYNJ also leverages the JFK redevelopment project as an opportunity to support and empower Local Business Enterprises (LBEs) and Minority and Women-owned Business Enterprises (MWBEs). The Redevelopment Program has committed to a 30% MWBE goal across all elements of the project.



JFKR Community – Advisory Council returns to in person meetings

On June 30, 2022, The JFK Redevelopment Outreach team held its first Community Advisory Council. Approximately 103 attendees met in person at Black Spectrum Theatre in Jamaica, NY.

The Council was excited to once again be able to meet with the public and hear updates regarding the Port Authority and the JFK Redevelopment project. Chairs from the four committees of Business Development, Career/Workforce Development, Education and Environmental Stewardship spoke about their current agenda and announced their ongoing activities.

Institute of Concessions (IOC)

Currently, the Community Outreach Center is reviewing applications to fill the role of Program Coordinator for a forthcoming community initiative: The Institute of Concessions. The Institute of Concessions will assist qualified businesses in obtaining all necessary certifications as well as providing education and training to prepare them to operate at an airport. The institute will be managed by an experienced professional and all courses will be taught by industry subject matter experts. The goal of the institute is to create a pool of qualified and certified businesses that are equipped to bid, win, and operate a JFK concession stand.

The Program Coordinator may be a sole proprietor or business that has or desires to obtain their Minority and Women-owned Business Enterprise (MWBE) and/or Airport Concessions Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (ACDBE) certification. The selected applicant will undergo a business review to verify their respective experience and capabilities for fulfilling the position. If the candidate needs to obtain their certification, they will be guided through the process with the support of the Port Authority through the Community Outreach Center.

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Project Spotlight | Airfield Improvements

JFK Airport has over 140 buildings located throughout the 5000 acres of airport property. Due to changing needs, many of these buildings have been abandoned and mothballed for years. The Redevelopment Program identified Buildings 121 and 122 which were formerly used as airline catering facilities as an opportunity to make better use of the property they occupy. Building 121 is approximately 2,500 SF and Building 122 is approximately 77,000 SF.

Aircraft deicing is an FAA regulatory requirement and an important component of aircraft winter operations. The deicing chemical,

glycol, used in the deicing process is toxic and can pose health and environmental risks if the disposal is not properly managed. As part of its redevelopment, the Hangar 12 multiuse hardstand and deicing pad will have the capability to recycle the chemical for reuse where possible. Fluid that cannot be recycled will be sent to a waste facility for disposal.

These projects are intentionally performed

in sequence over a broad span of time to enable the phasing to be completed in smaller projects that can be awarded to smaller specialized businesses. Construction for the West

Hardstand is scheduled for completion around the end of 2023 and the South Multi-use hardstand will be complete by the end of 2024.
